To all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting:

WHEREAS, There has been deposited in the General Land Office of the United States a Certificate of the Register of the Land Office at Marquette, Michigan, whereby it appears that pursuant to the provisions of the Revised Statutes of the United States, Chapter five, Title thirty-two, in relation to Homesteads on the Public Lands, and supplemental Statutes and of the Act of Congress of July 4, 1884, entitled "An Act making appropriations for the current and contingent expenses of the Indian Department, and for fulfilling treaty stipulations with various Indian Tribes for the year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and eighty-five, and for other purposes," the claim of Angeline Wab-nin-kee, Widow of John Wab-nin-kee, an Indian, has been established and duly consummated in conformity to law, for the northeast quarter of the southwest quarter and the northwest quarter of the southeast quarter of Section eighteen in Township thirty-eight north of Range ten west of the Michigan Meridian, Michigan, containing eighty acres, according to the Official Plat of the Survey of the said land returned to the General Land Office by the Surveyor General:

NOW KNOW YE, That the UNITED STATES OF AMERICA, in consideration of the premises, and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act of Congress of July 4, 1884, hereby declares that it does and will hold the land above described for the period of twenty-five years, in trust for the sole use and benefit of the said Angeline Wab-nin-kee, or in case of her decease, of her heirs, according to the laws of the State where such land is located, and at the expiration of said period the United States will convey the same by patent to the said Angeline Wab-nin-kee, or her heirs as aforesaid, in fee, discharged of said trust, and free from all charge or incumbrance whatsoever.
